Disconnections for non-payment are currently suspended for Ameren, Spire and City of St. Louis Water Division. Normal billing for customers' usage will continue and will be due after the pandemic.

RENT

All evictions have been paused statewide. This includes filings for new evictions as well as previously existing eviction orders in the City of St. Louis until April 17, 2020. This does not change rent due, but does allow you to stay in place during the pandemic. If you are unable to pay rent due to COVID-19, contact your landlord directly or St. Louis Housing Authority at 314.531.4770.

MORTGAGES

Mortgage lenders are also assisting aid during COVID-19. Call your mortgage company to learn more about their hardship services due to employment changes for COVID-19 relief. Foreclosures and evictions for FHA loans and loans backed by Fannie Mae or Freddie Mac have been suspended until May 17, 2020.
